Making his name in the Renault Clio Cup Championship as part of the BTCC support package, Josh took the 2014 title fight down to the wire in the season finale where he eventually ended the year as Vice Champion.

That performance helped to catapult him onto the BTCC grid, and he made his BTCC debut in 2015. Taking an impressive seven top-ten finishes in his maiden season, Josh's performance earned him the Jack Sears Trophy as top rookie.

Notching up the wins and podiums over the following seasons, Josh quickly established himself as a front-running contender, but a lack of pre-season testing and team consistency hampered his potential to challenge for the title.

A move to the BTC Racing squad for 2019 reaped huge rewards. Piloting the newly-acquired Honda Civic Type-R (FK8) to three superb victories, with four further podium finishes, Josh celebrated his best BTCC season to date, ending the year fourth in the overall standings, and as the Independent Vice-Champion.

Back in the BTC Racing line-up for the 2020 title challenge, Josh has his sights firmly set on the overall Championship Title.
